Entry regulations and working permit

General freedom of trade exists in Germany and foreign investors are accordingly not subject to any special conditions. Foreigners making investments or setting up companies are governed by the same regulations as native citizens of Germany.

There is, however, one major exception: Before a foreigner may commence business in the Federal Republic of Germany, he must obtain a residence permit for the specific self-employment. The application must specifically mention the fact that the applicant intends to engage in entrepreneurial activity in the Federal Republic of Germany.

The requirements you must fulfill to obtain the appropriate residence permit depend primarily on your nationality. The entry and residence regulations applicable in Germany differ according to your country of origin. Please obtain information about the current entry regulations for your country on the Internet site of the German Foreign Office. (www.auswaertiges-amt.de).

Citizens of EU-member States, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway and Switzerland

EU citizens and citizens of Iceland, Norway, Liechtenstein and Switzerland may enter, live and work in Germany. They are only required to register with the responsible registration offices in the same way as native citizens of Germany.

Citizens of New EU-member States (Accession to the EU on 1 May 2004 / January 1st 2007)

EU citizens generally do not need a visa for entry to Germany. EU citizens are basically entitled to free movement of labor and may also work in Germany if desired. However, temporary regulations apply to citizens of the countries admitted to the EU on 1 May 2004 (except Cyprus and Malta) and 1 January 2007.

Citizens of these countries (Bulgaria, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Romania, Czech Republic, Hungary) may only commence work in Germany if they are in possession of an EU work permit. This is to be requested direct from the employment agency responsible for the intended place of work. They are also required to register with the responsible registration offices in the same way as native citizens of Germany.

Citizens of Australia, Canada, Israel, Japan, New Zealand, South Korea and the United States of America

Citizens of Australia, Israel, Japan, Canada, the Republic of Korea, New Zealand and the United States of America can also obtain the necessary residence permit from the responsible immigration office in Germany after entry. Please note that the intended employment cannot be commenced until the relevant residence permit has been granted.

Citizens of all other countries

All other foreign citizens require a visa for staying in Germany. For visits of up to 3 months per half year, citizens of states for which the European Community has abolished the visa requirement do not need a visa. A list of countries for which a visa is required is available on the Internet site of the German Foreign Office.

All other foreign citizens must apply for a suitable visa from the German consulate/embassy responsible for their place of residence before entering Germany. A processing period of several months should be allowed for granting a visa that allows the applicant to work in Germany (employed or self-employed).

Access to the German labor market

Access to the labor market is limited in principle to certain occupational groups and requires the prior approval of the labor administration.

Special regulations apply to highly qualified persons, e.g. scientists and specialists, whose relocation is simplified by the Immigration Act (current minimum salary of 84,600 Euros). For the first time, German immigration law contains explicit regulations that allow foreigners from third countries to settle as self-employed persons in Germany. A requirement for this is an overriding economic interest or a special regional need, a positive impact of the activity on the economy and assured financing. These requirements are usually fulfilled if at least 500,000 Euros are to be invested and five jobs created.

Establishing a Company

There are generally no restrictions or extra requirements for foreign investors planning to establish a business in Germany. Germany supports freedom of foreign trade and payments, as laid down in the Foreign Trade and Payments Act (AWG).

A decisive step before setting up a company is the choice of a suitable legal structure. The following information on the formalities with regard to the foundation of each legal form gives you an initial idea of a suitable legal form for your business.

Business registration

Generally speaking, your business in Germany must be registered with

- ⇒ the Public Affairs Office (*Ordnungsamt der Stadt Nürnberg*) and
- ⇒ in the commercial register (*Handelsregister*).

Registration with the Public Affairs Office Nuremberg

Every commercial enterprise must register its activities at its place of business. Freelancers are not required to register as a business, but must contact their tax office direct.

You require the following documents for business registration:

- ⇒ Identity card or passport for checking personal details
- ⇒ In the event of power of attorney, a written certificate of authority and the identity card/passport of the principal and the agent
- ⇒ Extract from the register for companies entered in the commercial, association or cooperative register
- ⇒ A residence permit that includes permission to exercise a self-employed activity, if you do not possess German citizenship
- ⇒ A special license is required for working in some fields of business, e.g. pawnbroker, guard, auctioneer, broker, craft trade, travel trade.

The Trade Office automatically informs the following authorities, with which you must also be registered: tax office, responsible employers liability insurance association, Chamber of Industry and Trade (IHK) or Chamber of Craft Trades (HWK), district court (commercial register), Trade Inspectorate (responsible for health and safety of your employees and customers). The business registration fee is 40 €.

Entry in the commercial register

The commercial register is kept by the district courts and provides legal reliability for trading. The commercial register at the district court provides the public with information about the circumstances of the registered business enterprise. It includes information on who is allowed to represent a company and who is responsible for liabilities. It comprises two sections. Section A is for entering individual traders, ordinary partnerships (oHG) and joint stock companies (KG). Section B is for stock corporations (AG) and limited companies (GmbH).

The entry in the commercial register is usually made by a notary. Fees are payable to the district court for the entry in the commercial register. The amount of the fee for the court and notary depends on the number of shareholders and the share capital.

The Federal Chamber of German Civil Law Notaries offers a list of licensed notaries.

Support programs

Many support programs are available from the federal government, the Free State of Bavaria and the EU for starting up or settling a business in the region. Most of these are loans, but there are also some non-repayable grants. Typical features of public support loans include attractive interest rates, long terms and frequently an initial period of time before you must start repayment.

The business tax is the most important source of income for local authorities to finance their public spending. The business tax rate in cities with more than 300,000 inhabitants is between 410 and 490. The rate for Nuremberg is in the middle of the range at 447.

German Social Security System

The social security insurance system provides extensive protection for employees and guarantees social security in society.

The social security system covers:

- ⇒ health insurance
- ⇒ nursing care insurance
- ⇒ pension insurance
- ⇒ unemployment insurance
- ⇒ accident insurance

The social security insurance contributions are paid jointly by the employer and employee, except for the statutory accident insurance scheme. Accident insurance contributions are paid in full by the employer. This means the employer must allow for the employer's share of social insurance contributions, which is some 20 percent on top of the employee's annual salary.

Registration of employees

A company requires a company registration number as soon as it engages an employee. The Central Registration Number Service of the Federal Labor Agency in Saarbrücken is responsible for the nationwide issue and updating of company registration numbers. Please do not forget to apply for a number within two weeks.

Service for „Expats“

Young and old, newly arrived and long-established people live together in harmony in Nuremberg. Families feel at home here, too. This is helped by an affordable cost of living, continually improved child care facilities, and a high level of security.

Finding the right place to live

From apartments in old art nouveau buildings, penthouse apartments on the banks of the River Pegnitz, modern living in new buildings or factory lofts to a house in the country: Dream homes can still become reality relatively easily and at attractive prices in Nuremberg.

On top of the monthly rent the tenant must pay overheads for such services as water, electricity and heating, which amount to at least approx. 30 percent of the monthly rent.

Education

Child care facilities: In Germany, every child between the age of three and six has a legal claim to a place in a kindergarten. Nuremberg is to increase the number of child care facilities up to 2013. Several kindergartens provide additional language programs. Little Giants, an English-German child care center, started in 2008.

School System

Attending a state-run school is free of charge, and compulsory from the age of six. The standards in state schools are usually high, teachers are highly qualified, and student qualifications are internationally recognized. For the first four years, children usually attend a primary school in the place where they live. At the end of primary school, parents can choose between various types of secondary schools for different levels of education (Hauptschule, Realschule, Gymnasium), depending on their child's interests and abilities. Students who gain a suitable qualification (Gymnasium) can attend university.

Students who gain a qualification from a technical or specialized secondary school, which takes one year less, can attend a university of applied science, whose courses are more practically oriented. Many schools have developed their own profiles focusing on certain areas. In addition to schools (Gymnasium) specializing in music, there are schools that focus on natural sciences, languages, or sports, for example. Nuremberg offers a full range of schools.
