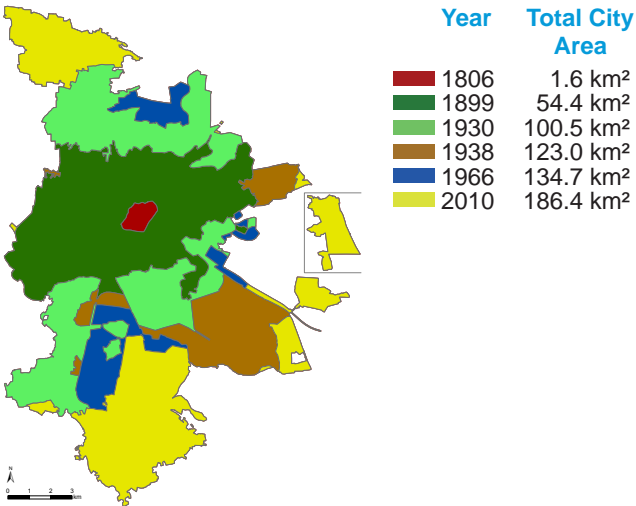

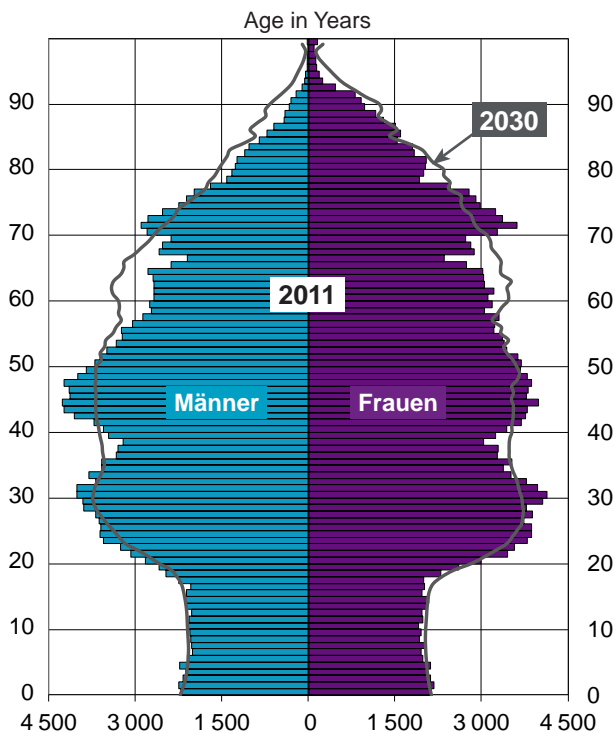

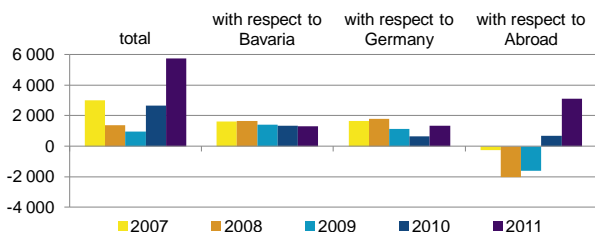

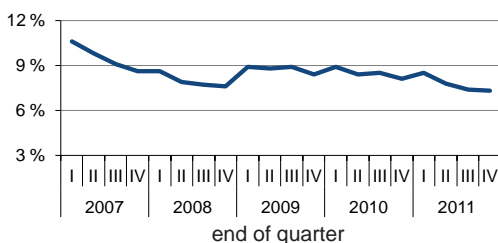

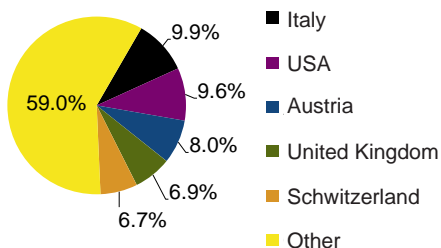

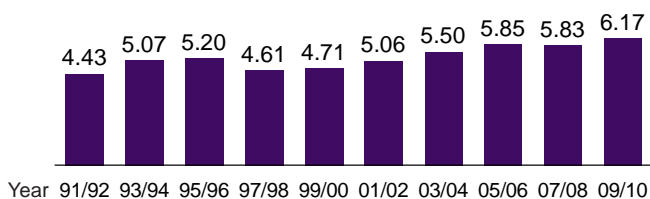

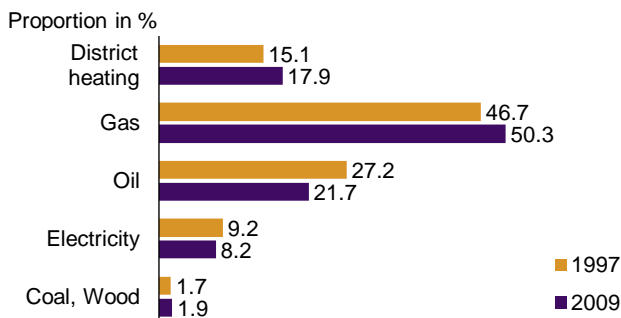
## Rent before Utilities
