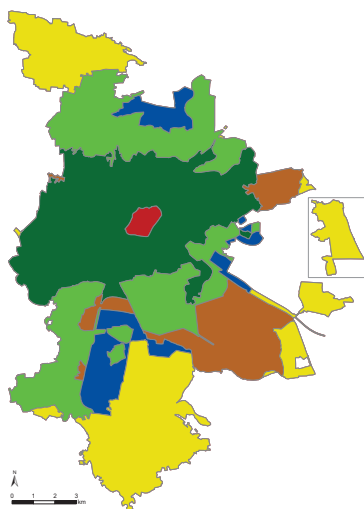

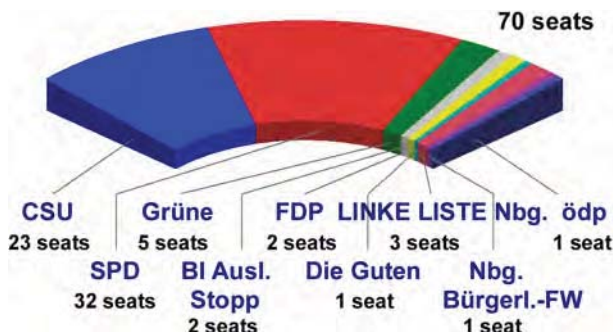

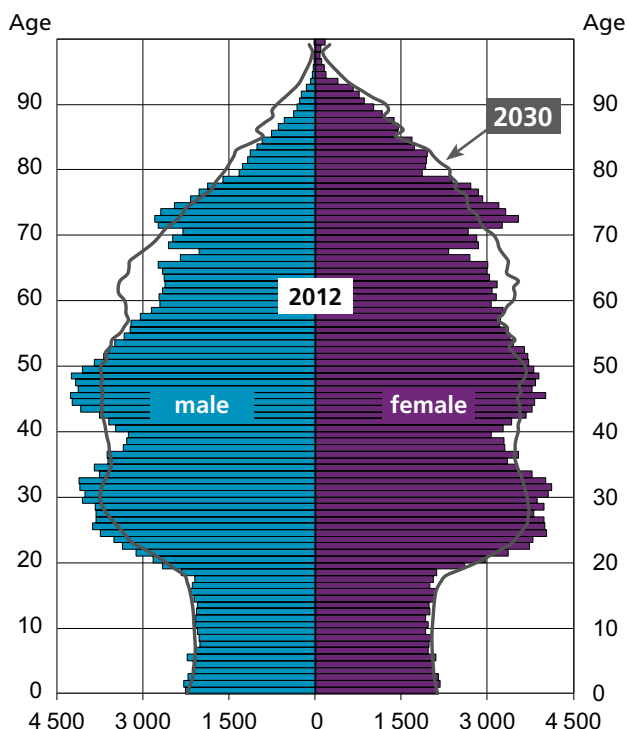

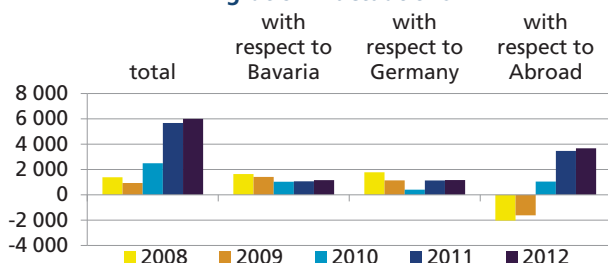

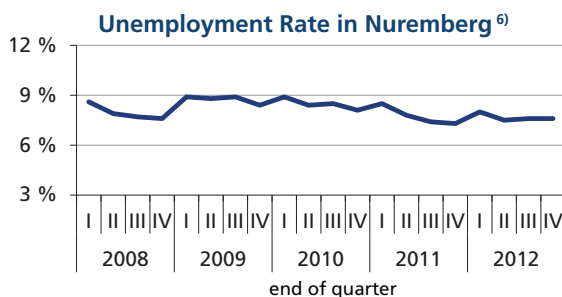

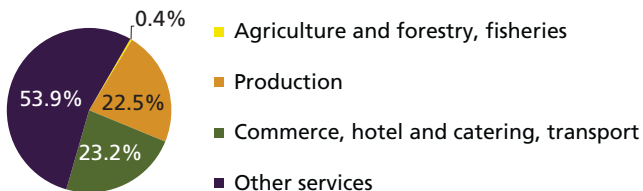

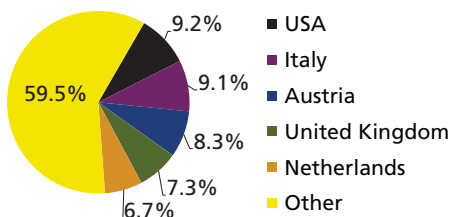

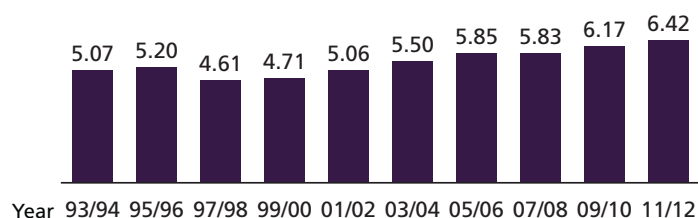

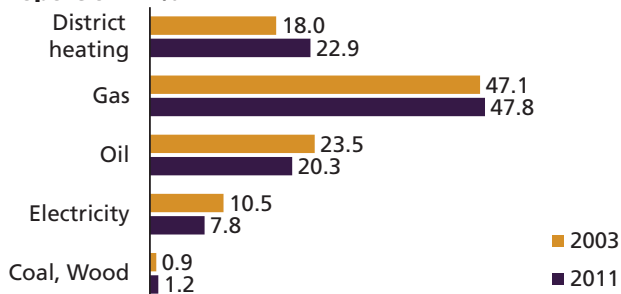
Average net rent for privately financed apartments exclusive of heating (€ per m²)
