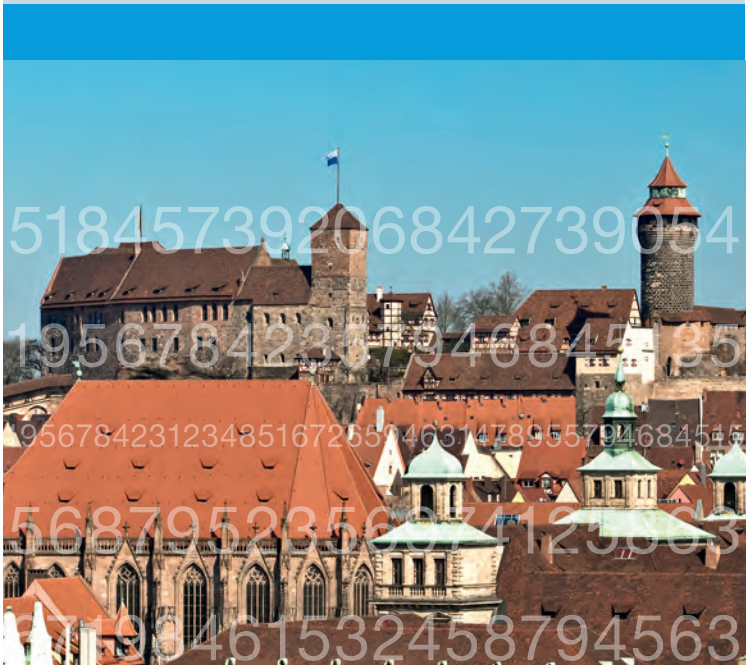

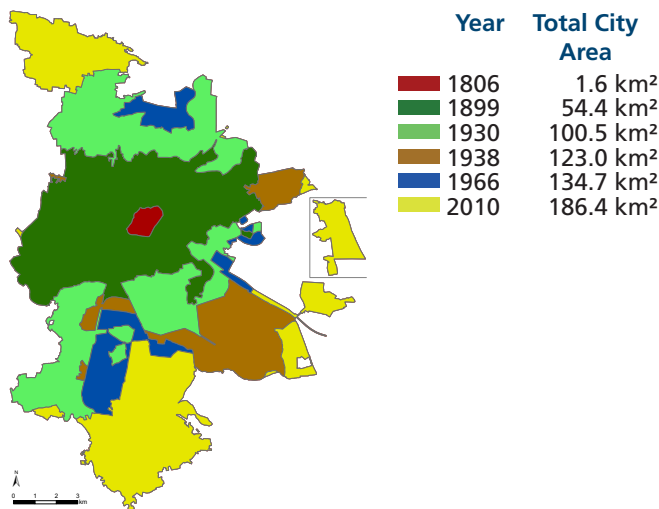

Evolution of City Area since 1806



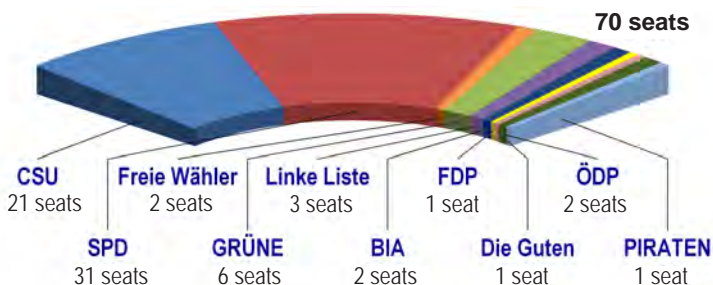

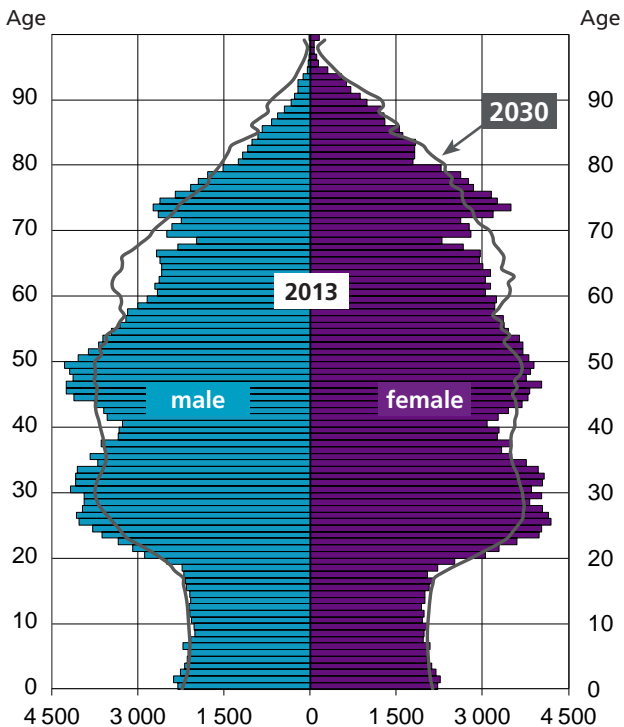

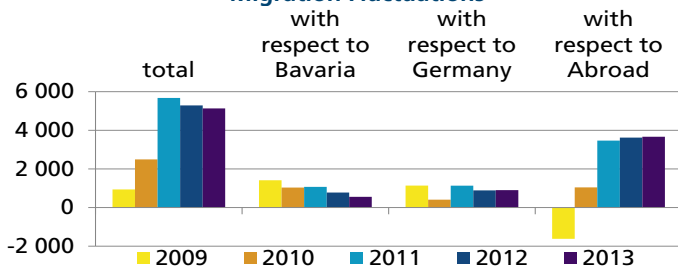

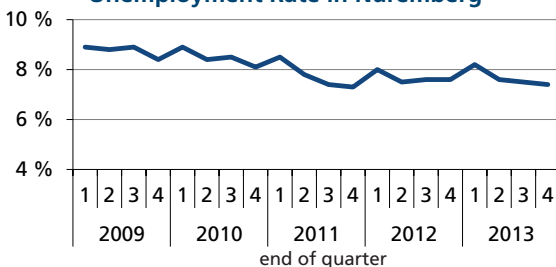

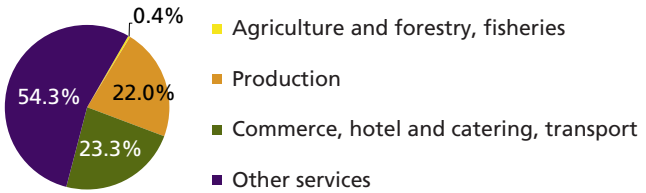
Unemployment Rate in Nuremberg ⁷⁾

Employment by economic sector June 2013



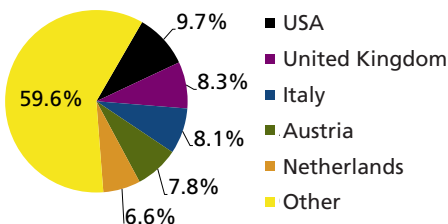

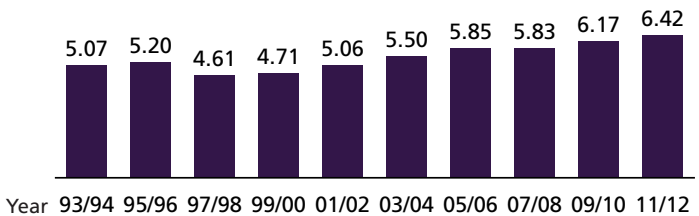

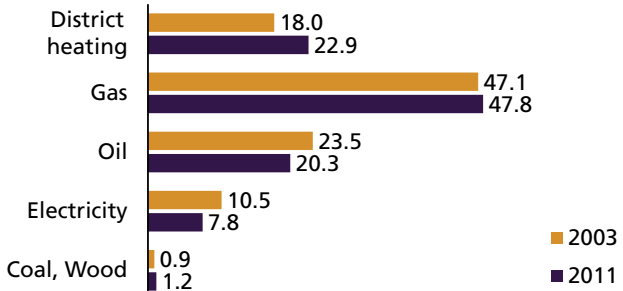
Average net rent for privately financed apartments exclusive of heating (€ per m²)
